Nature of Support

Academic Year 2014-15:

- Pupil premium teacher and extra TA time to provide 1:1 and small group support in English and maths across the school.
- Bug Club reading on-line resource used across the school with a particular focus in Upper KS2.
- To support emotional well-being through pastoral systems and training and deployment of staff to deliver therapeutic play.
- Lunch time club to develop social skills and language development.
- Improving lateness and attendance through the Fast Track system.
- Facilitating engagement of pupils in extra curricular activities.
- Develop self-esteem and improved attitudes to learning through individual and small group support.
- Provide financial support to access residential visits and the personal development opportunities they offer.

Curriculum Focus of PPG Spending

Academic Year 2014-15:

- To continue to close the gap in attainment and progress within reading, writing and maths for PP and their peers.
- To support pupils to make accelerated progress through targeted interventions.
- Ensure pupils have equal access to extra curricular activities.

Measuring the Impact of PPG Spending

- Termly PP meetings (supporting on-going professional dialogue about standards).
- PP and FSM pupil conferencing.
- PP and FSM attendance in-line with non-FSM and non-PP children.
- Regular review of attainment and progress measures by Leadership Team and Governors.
